School Donates Over 1,000 lbs. of Food to Local Food Bank

REDMOND, WA – While most schools have a charitable component around the holidays, MCH (Montessori Children's House, mchkids.com) considers giving back a part of their curriculum.

Beginning in November 2019, the school that serves students from 6 weeks old up until 8th grade started another campaign in support of HopeLink. This is the third year that the AMS-accredited school has chosen HopeLink to partner with and the decision was purely intentional.

“We wanted to find an organization that was close to home,” said Head of School Jennifer McConnell. “Our Community Engagement Program is designed to show students that helping people doesn't feel out of touch; there are people in need right here in our own neighborhoods.”

Taking a cue from HopeLink's 'most needed' items list, the students gathered resources for a month. Middle school students inventoried the food, elementary students loaded the truck, donations came from infant/toddler and Early Childhood classrooms, and middle schoolers delivered and unloaded the truck at HopeLink.

“Loading the food into the facility is a huge part of the process,” said Middle School Program Director and Lead Teacher, Marc Cobb. “It makes it real. It solidifies the impact of their efforts.”

As a result of the drive, MCH donated over a thousand pounds of food to HopeLink, helping fill the shelves right when the organization needed it most.
